## A BILL

To require performance and security audits of certain agency computer systems, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Pick Up After Your
- 5 DOGE Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITION.
- 7 In this Act, the term "appropriate congressional com-
- 8 mittee" means any committee with jurisdiction over an
- 9 agency that is the subject of an audit under this Act.

## 1 SEC. 3. UNITED STATES DOGE SERVICE ACCESS TO DATA.

- 2 Not later than 30 days after the date of enactment
- 3 of this Act, the Administrator of the United States DOGE
- 4 Service shall submit to the appropriate congressional com-
- 5 mittees and the Comptroller General of the United States
- 6 a full accounting of all Federal agencies where agency
- 7 DOGE teams, as defined in Executive Order 14158 (90
- 8 Fed. Reg. 8441; relating to establishing and implementing
- 9 the President's Department of Government Efficiency), or
- 10 individuals acting on behalf of, or at the instruction of,
- 11 the United States DOGE Service or agency DOGE teams,
- 12 accessed Federal agency computer systems, networks,
- 13 data, or information.

## 14 SEC. 4. COMPTROLLER GENERAL STUDIES.

- 15 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after the
- 16 date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General
- 17 of the United States shall commence a comprehensive
- 18 audit of Federal agency computer systems and networks
- 19 accessed by the United States DOGE Service, the U.S.
- 20 DOGE Service Temporary Organization, or any employees
- 21 or volunteers affiliated with those agencies, or, if applica-
- 22 ble, associated agency DOGE teams, to identify security
- 23 vulnerabilities or bugs in software installed, created, or
- 24 modified by the United States DOGE Service, the U.S.
- 25 DOGE Service Temporary Organization, or any employees

- 3 (b) Priority Review.—In conducting the audits de-
- 4 scribed in subsection (a), the Comptroller General shall
- 5 give priority to reviews of the systems, networks, and data-
- 6 bases of the Social Security Administration, the Depart-
- 7 ment of Health and Human Services and the Centers for
- 8 Medicare & Medicaid Services, and the Department of the
- 9 Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service.
- 10 (c) Initial Audit Results.—Not later than 1 year
- 11 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller
- 12 General shall submit to the appropriate congressional
- 13 committees and agency heads a report or reports describ-
- 14 ing the results of the comprehensive systems audits per-
- 15 formed under subsection (a) for the Social Security Ad-
- 16 ministration, the Department of Health and Human Serv-

- 22 (d) Final Audit Results.—Not later than 2 years
- 23 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller
- 24 General shall submit to the appropriate congressional
- 25 committees and agency heads a report or reports describ-

- 2 formed under subsection (a) for other Federal agencies se-
- 3 lected for review by the Comptroller General, in consulta-
- 4 tion with the appropriate congressional committees, in-
- 5 cluding recommendations for legislation and administra-
- 6 tive actions as the Comptroller General determines appro-
- 7 priate.
- 8 (e) AGENCY ACTION.—Not later than 90 days after
- 9 receipt of an audit report by an agency head under sub-
- 10 sections (c) or (d), the agency head shall—
- 11 (1) fix any vulnerabilities or bugs identified in
- the report; and
- 13 (2) submit to the appropriate committee of ju-
- 14 risdiction a report on the status of those
- vulnerabilities or bugs.
